Herbert Kretzmer (Lyricist) was born in South Africa, where he began a career in journalism writing the commentary for a weekly cinema newsreel. He came to live in London in 1954, and has since pursued twin careers as newspaperman and songwriter. He was feature writer on The Daily Sketch and a profile writer on The Sunday Despatch. He joined The Daily Express in 1960 and later became its drama critic, a post he held for 18 years, covering about 3,000 first nights. From 1979 to 1987, he wrote television criticism for The Daily Mail, winning, in this capacity, two national press awards. As a lvric writer he wrote weekly songs for That Was The Week That Was and the later Ned Sherrin television shows. He won an Ivor Novello Award for the Peter Sellers/Sophia Loren comedy song Goodness Gracious Me . Other award-winning songs include two written with, and for, Charles Aznavour: Yesterday When I Was Young and the chart-topping She . Herbert Kretzmer wrote the book and lyrics for the West End musical Our Man Crichton, which starred Kenneth More and Millicent Martin, and the lyrics for The Four Musketeers, which ran for over a year at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, starring Harry Secombe as D Artagnan. He also supplied the lyrics for the Anthony Newley musical film Can Heironymous Merkin Ever Forget Mercy Humppe and Find True Happiness? He was the co-lyricist for Kristina which he wrote with Björn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson (ABBA), premiered at Carnegie Hall, New York, in September 2009. Herbert Kretzmer s latest work is Marguerite, written with Michel Legrand, Alain Boublil and Claude-Michel Schönberg.

Music Theatre International (www.MTIShows.com) is one of the world's leading theatrical licensing agencies, granting performance rights to both professional and amateur theatres. With over 350 musicals in its catalogue, including the best of Broadway as well as a vibrant collection of musicals adapted for performance by children, MTI works directly with the authors of these shows to provide official scripts, musical materials, and other resources to over 60,000 theatrical organizations throughout the world.

Alain Boublil (Book and Lyrics) is the author of the librettos and original lyrics for the musicals La Révolution Française, Les Misérables, Miss Saigon, Martin Guerre, and The Pirate Queen, all in collaboration with Claude-Michel Schönberg, as well as Marguerite with Michel Legrand, Claude-Michel Schönberg, and Herbert Kretzmer. Boublil is the recipient of two Tony Awards, two Grammys, two Victoire de la Musique Awards and a Molière Award for Les Misérables. He received an Evening Standard Drama Award for Miss Saigon and a Laurence Olivier Award for Martin Guerre. In 2014, he wrote a new play, Manhattan Parisienne, with songs by Gershwin, Cole Porter, Charles Aznavour, Michel Legrand, Steve Allen, and more, which recently played in New York. He is the author/librettist of Abbacadabra, of the stage adaptation of Demy/Legrand film Les Demoiselles de Rochefort, author of the play The Diary of Adam and Eve (based upon short stories by Mark Twain), and the prizewinning French novel Les dessous de soi. He co-wrote the screenplay of the Golden Globe-winning and Oscar-nominated film Les Misérables. He has received a New York Chapter Honors Grammy award for his outstanding contribution to the creative community. Currently he is working on a revised version of Martin Guerre to open in the U.K. Boublil lives in New York with his wife, actress/singer Marie Zamora, and is the father of four sons.

Born in 1944 of Hungarian parents, **Claude-Michel Schönberg** *(Composer)* began his career in France as a singer, writer and producer of pop songs. In collaboration with Alain Boublil he is the book cowriter and the composer of La Révolution Française, Les Misérables, Miss Saigon, Martin Guerre and The Pirate Queen. In 2008 his new musical, Marguerite, in collaboration with Alain Boublil, Michel Legrand and Herbert Kretzmer opened at the Haymarket Theatre in London. Claude-Michel has

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supervised overseas productions and coproduced several international cast albums of his shows. In 2001 he composed his first ballet score, Wuthering Heights, which was created by the Northern Ballet in 2002. His ballet, Cleopatra, which opened in 2011, was his second collaboration with David Nixon and his seventh complete score. In 2012 Claude-Michel co-wrote the screenplay and reconceived the music for the Les Misérables musical movie. Golden Globe winner. Oscar nominee and recent Grammy award winner for outstanding contribution to the creative community, Mr. Schönberg married the English ballerina, Charlotte Talbot, in 2003. He is the father of one son and two daughters.

We cannot be more proud of you, Landon! Your hard work and dedication shows when you take the stage.

Dramaturgical Note

Victor Hugo's historical fiction masterpiece, Les Misérables, is an epic story of desperate people seeking redemption: redemption in the eyes of God, the law and/or each other; redemption from their circumstances, whether partially selfinflicted like the Thénardiers, or put upon them by their government, others or sheer poverty, such as Fantine; redemption for others, as in the students led by Enjolras; redemption for their family history, such as Cosette and Marius and most of all, redemption from one's sense of self – embodied in Jean Valjean and Javert.

The prologue introduces us to Valjean, paroled after 19 years of hard-labor prison. We catch our first glimpse of his counterpart Javert and all his reverence for authority in the law. Even though he is paroled, Valjean is literally and figuratively branded an outcast, with no means to escape his circumstances. Only through the saintly generosity of the Bishop of Digne does Valjean see that there may be "another way to go" – towards redemption.

Act I re-introduces Valjean under the guise of Monsieur Madeleine, having broken parole and used his wealth and ingenuity to become a factory owner and mayor of the seaside town, Montreuil-sur-Mer. We also meet Fantine, a desperate woman who has left her illegitimate child in the care of others, so that she can work to redeem them both. We see even more examples of the depravity society can create when miserable people cannot find salvation. In the midst of this, Valjean, Fantine and Javert's intersection propels the rest of the story.

After Valjean eludes Javert and rescues Fantine's child Cosette, they live in fear and hiding, but develop a tender and beautiful father-daughter affection – the only love Valjean will ever know. Cosette comes of age during a tumultuous time in the history of France, when the populace is actively seeking redemption from poverty and rampant disease, with a king and a government that does not speak for them. One of the rare exceptions is General Lamarque, a voice for the populace. Rich students and poor citizens alike seek change and end up willing to fight to the death to obtain it.

In the midst of this tumult, we see the passion of youth, both in romantic love and in patriotic fervor. The Thénardiers return, still thieving with their haggard daughter Éponine, who simply wants to be noticed by the naïve Marius. Javert reappears with his steadfast authority and Valjean desperately tries to protect Cosette and himself. Led by Enjolras and Marius and inspired by young Gavroche, the students and citizens take to their hastily-constructed barricades throughout the city, determined to "fight for the right to be free."

Act II brings us right into the heart of the conflict of the June uprising. In the midst of this chaos, we see Valjean attempt to redeem himself with Javert, driving Javert to struggle mightily, unable to reconcile his concept of right and wrong with the "monster" that is this benevolent convict. Valjean exhibits ultimate sacrifice, willing to give himself away to redeem his own soul and to gift Cosette and Marius a life they could only live without him. In the midst of all these misérables, Valjean indeed redeems his soul and the story of "those who always loved" both Cosette and Marius. Finally, the entire ensemble asks us once more to honor their story and to "hear the people sing."

While this story and this musical is filled with sadness, it is the seeking and finding of redemption and hope that makes it compelling and counterintuitively uplifting. Hugo describes it as "the march from evil to good, from injustice to justice, from the false to the true, from night to day, from appetite to conscience, from rottenness to life, from brutality to duty, from Hell to Heaven, from nothingness to God." If it were merely sad, the book would not be hailed as an all-time masterpiece and the musical would not have enjoyed such tremendous success. Consider this – Les Mis has never closed in London's West End, running for 35 straight years. In London, New York, all around the world and even in southern NH, there is always "One Day More!"

INNOVATION Summer Camps

Ages 7-14

All camps are designed to provide a fun, low-stress environment for kids of all levels of experience to explore the art of theatre through games, workshops, and the creation of a final performance. Each session will have a different focus, as detailed below.

Session A: Performance

June 26-28, July 1-3 • Cost: \$220

Prior to the start of camp, students will send in a video audition and be assigned a role in a 30-minute show. The six-day session will be devoted to teaching students about theatre and putting together a full performance where every student is involved, complete with singing, dancing and acting.

Session B: Presentation

July 15-19 • Cost: \$200

This camp will be focused on developing audition technique through acting and singing coaching. Each student will have the opportunity to work on a monologue and learn an audition cut of a song, and to work with teachers on monologue and song choice and presentation skills. The session will culminate in a capstone revue where every student will be given the chance to shine. Space is limited.

Session C: Production

August 5-9 • Cost: \$200

In this session, students will have the opportunity to devise their own original show. Teachers will work with students to generate ideas and develop a plot, characters, and dialogue through improvisation, and students will present their completed show on the final day of camp. The production may include an element of music and/or dance, depending on the students' interest.
